
## **Ex Services** Bowls

## Coota Library Receives Grant

Cootamundra Library has been awarded a \$500.00 grant from National Backyard Cricket, a fundraising program established by national charity The LBW Trust. National Backyard Cricket raises funds for education projects offered in country libraries across Australia and overseas tertiary education. The funds were the result of the inaugural National Backyard Cricket program which was held around Australia over last summer. In support of country libraries, Harvey Norman have matched the funds raised for libraries enabling the program to support the technology needs of more libraries.

Cootamundra Library is one of 54 country libraries across Australia to receive a funding grant. The library grant-making process was managed by Friends of Libraries Australia (FOLA), a national non-profit that represents the 12-million Australians who are members of their local public libraries. Cootamundra Library will use the funding to buy Lego to establish a Lego club for children. The club will be held on Saturday mornings from 10.30am till 11.30am.

There were 125 games of backyard cricket played during the National Backyard Cricket campaign, with over 320 donors helping to raise more than \$125,000. The events were supported by cricketing royalty including; Justin Langer, Alex Blackwell, Ryan Carters, Russel Arnold, Alyssa Healy, Ed Cowan and Michael Holding.

David Vaux, Chair of The LBW Trust said, "This year's National Backyard Cricket day was an opportunity for families and communities across Australia to come together and have fun playing our iconic game after an extremely challenging 12 months, while supporting an important cause at the same time. We are so thrilled we can support local libraries as we know they have a powerful impact on learning and life outcomes.

"Public libraries offer a range of services to their communities including facilitating safe study spaces, holding computer literacy classes, and offering assistance with resumes and cover letters to help people gain employment. There is a particular need for increased funding in rural and regional areas to support this work. We are really pleased we can provide funding to support this work."

\*\*Australian sport was in the headlines last weekend with Ashleigh Barty and Dylan Alcott winning tennis' ultimate prize - Wimbledon. Ash, as a youngster from Ipswich, idolised Evonne Goolagong/Cawley who won Wimbledon for the second time in 1980. Barty had a dream to follow in Evonne's footsteps and 41 years later she realised that ambition by becoming the Wimbledon champion. Showing great skill and determination, Ash overcame a serious injury prior to the tournament to claim tennis' top trophy in a humble and respectful manner. Dylan Alcott is building an impressive resume in wheelchair tennis and continues to dominate the sport. Dylan is another modest champion and joins Ash as tremendous role models for all sports people, especially our younger generation. Both players will now head to the Olympics in Tokyo.

\*\*Junior sport gets another boost in town with the Cootamundra Sports Stadium to host programs in junior netball, basketball and soccer. All three sports will be played in two divisions for boys and girls aged 7-10 and 11-14. Games will be played between 4-6pm, starting with netball on Wednesday July 21, basketball on Tuesday July 27 and soccer on Monday, August 2. Each session

ates Mrs Edna Williams congratulated six bowlers on passing their examination to become club umpires - a first for the Cootamundra club. Those who gained accreditation were Mollie Dopper, Mill Dickson, Edna Harris, Sel

Orgill, Ene Watters and Edna Williams. July 1971: Cootamundra Turf Club member Roley Forsyth was nominated by the local club for the position of vice-president of the Southern District Racing Association (SDRA), which administers thoroughbred racing in the south west and Riverina regions. The SDRA Annual General Meeting is to be held in Wagga early next month and Forsyth is expected to be elected to this senior position. July 1981: At the Annual General Meeting of the Cootamundra Men's Ex-Services Bowling Club Stan Whitechurch was elected president, Max Hull as secretary and Eric Armstrong as treasurer. July 1991: Robert Hargraves and Ian Whybrow won the Cootamundra Golf Club foursome championship after a sudden death playoff with Wayne Loiterton and Kevin Deep. Both pairs finished the 36 holes with an aggregate score of 149. July 2001: The Cootamundra Darts Association awarded Life Membership to Col Maxwell for his ongoing support of the organisation at their Annual General Meeting. Shirley Lopez was elected as president, Di O'Neill secretary and Chris Yardley treasurer with Carol Waugh the publicity officer for the next 12 months.
