

Childhood cancer in Australia

UNDERSTANDING THE FACTS & IMPACT

Childhood cancer is a heartbreaking reality that affects almost 1,000 Australian children and adolescents each year. What should be a carefree time, filled with play, fun and laughter becomes a difficult journey, full of physical and emotional challenges. As the leading cause of disease-related death among children under 15, one in five children diagnosed with cancer in Australia will not survive.

As childhood cancer rates have been increasing over the past few decades in Australia, there are now over 80 different types of childhood cancers, many still incurable. Leukaemia, brain tumours and lymphoma are the most common types of childhood cancer in Australia. Of the children and adolescents that do survive each year, many are at a higher risk of developing secondary cancers and experiencing long-term health problems.

THE IMPACT ON FAMILIES

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Childhood cancer impacts not only the child but their entire family. Parents, siblings and loved ones can also face overwhelming emotional, practical and financial challenges:

Financial hardship	Often, one or both parents need to reduce work hours or stop working altogether
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to care for their child with cancer full-time.

Emotional strain A childhood cancer diagnosis, treatment and long-term effects can be incredibly

stressful and overwhelming for the entire family.

Displacement of siblings Siblings may feel neglected during the treatment process, which can cause

additional stress and anxiety for everyone.

Extended treatment time Childhood cancer treatment is a long and difficult process, often lasting for several

years.

dysfunction, amputation, neurocognitive deficits, impaired fertility, and secondary

malignancies.

Difficult decision-making Parents may need to make difficult decisions on behalf of their child, which can be

emotionally taxing and can have a lasting impact on the family.

Social isolation Childhood cancer can cause social isolation for both the child and their family

becasue of the need to limit exposure to other illnesses due to reduced immune

systems and the stress of treatment.

Impact on mental health Childhood cancer can impact the entire family's mental health, with depression,

anxiety and post-traumatic stress disorder common.

Education Due to treatment protocol, children don't have the ability to continue schooling

and develop social skills.

Health & wellbeing All family members have reduced time and finances to tend to their own wellbeing.

PHILANTHROPY IS VITAL TO CHILDHOOD CANCER IN AUSTRALIA

Unfortunately, childhood cancer research and funding are often limited, making it a challenging and heartbreaking journey for many Australian families. Since My Room began in 1993, there has been significant progress in recent years. Survival rates for several types of childhood cancers are on the rise, with the overall survival rate now sitting at around 84%, giving hope to many families.



Every dollar counts, and that's why we raise funds ethically and cost-effectively. At least 95%* of every donated dollar goes directly towards supporting children with cancer and their families. We hold a deductible gift recipient status (DGR1). We're also registered with the Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission.

OUR ORIGINS

Having a child diagnosed with cancer is a gut-wrenching experience. It's especially tough when you're stuck in a hospital room that doesn't feel like home. This was the reality faced by the Marcoccis, the McGraths, and the Rathbones. Instead of giving up, they decided to make a difference to create a more homely setting for families dealing with childhood cancer.

So in 1993, together with Dr Keith Waters and Mary McGowan OAM, they started raising money to renovate The Royal Children's Hospital's cancer ward. They reached their goal, but they knew they couldn't stop there. That's why they created "My Room." The name was inspired by the idea of making hospital rooms feel just like home – a warm, comfortable, safe space for families in difficult times.

Today, with the founding families and members still actively involved, My Room is made up of a group of individuals who volunteer their time, along with 11/2 staff members, pro and low bono suppliers, and loyal corporate partners. Over the past 30 years, we've raised over \$33 million to improve the quality of life for children and families affected by childhood cancer across Australia. While our impact has increased significantly, our passion, commitment and mission to beat childhood cancer remain unchanged.

Research & trials







These spacious havens, generously donated by IT entrepreneur Danny Wallis who bought them from Channel Nine's *The Block*, offers all the comforts of home and are equipped with various support services to help families through their stay. This ensures families stay together.

SPECIALIST CARE FOR CHILDREN WITH CANCER

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We're passionate about providing tailored care that addresses each child's unique needs, helping them manage their symptoms, side effects and overall health. Our funded positions include:

Comfort care clinician

Our comfort care clinician helps children and families develop their natural coping strategies at the beginning of their cancer diagnosis. They work alongside nurses in treatment rooms to make the experience less scary for children. Our clinician empowers children to feel in control of their pain management using special techniques such as bedside play and breathing exercises.

"My Room has been one of our silent champions for years within the cancer centre. Without their support, our role simply couldn't exist. We could treat the physical side of childhood cancer, but we wouldn't be caring for the mental side, too. We obviously find that incredibly important and believe they go hand in hand."

Dietitian

Our dietitian develops personalised nutrition plans for children with cancer to maintain a healthy weight, manage energy levels and reduce the risk of infections. This is important given proper nutrition plays a vital role in treatment tolerance and overall survival.

Occupational therapist

Our occupational therapist identifies and helps children with reduced hand function or cancer-related fatigue. They provide resources and support to help these children thrive by developing personalised plans that promote physical function and endurance.

Physiotherapist

Our physiotherapist provides high-quality assessments and interventions to maintain physical function during cancer treatment. They develop personalised exercise plans to promote physical strength, endurance and flexibility, which are essential for maintaining mobility and reducing the risk of long-term disabilities.

Psychologist

Our psychologist offers crucial emotional support to children with cancer and their families. Through tailored therapy sessions, they address any anxiety, depression, and other challenges that arise during treatment. Working closely with the medical team, our psychologist ensures a holistic approach, fostering healthy coping mechanisms and a positive outlook.

Social worker

Our oncology social worker provides emotional, social, practical and financial support to families navigating childhood cancer. They advocate for patients and families, offer targeted intervention for high-risk families, and provide supportive psychological care during bereavement.

Speech pathologist

Our speech pathologist identifies and treats communication or swallowing issues children may experience due to cancer treatment. They help children eat and take part in mealtimes without difficulty, minimising the impact of these issues.

INNOVATIVE MEDICAL EQUIPMENT

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In addition to clinical care, we're also proud to fund beds and wheelchairs as well as state-of-the-art equipment like distraction machines for MRIs and pumps for chemotherapy administration via drips, which can be used in the comfort of a child's home. These technologies not only make treatments more comfortable but can also lead to better treatment outcomes, reducing hospital stays and allowing children to spend more time at home.

COMMITMENT TO POWER NEXT-GENERATION TREATMENTS

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It takes a rare kind of commitment to conquer children's cancers, and that is exactly what's been made by My Room, with the establishment of an Australian first for childhood cancer research. Thanks to an extraordinary funding commitment, Hudson Institute of Medical Research will be home to the My Room Children's Cancer Charity Fellowship and Laboratory.

The five-year, \$2.25 million commitment will see Hudson Institute establish a dedicated My Room Children's Cancer Charity Laboratory, with childhood cancer specialist Assoc. Prof Jason Cain becoming the inaugural holder of the My Room Children's Cancer Charity Fellowship. He has a long and impressive record of cutting-edge research into paediatric connective tissue cancers (sarcomas) and brain cancers which will pay dividends for children affected by these types of cancers, and their families, for years to come.

Assoc. Prof Cain joined Hudson Institute of Medical Research in 2010, was appointed Head of the Developmental and Cancer Biology laboratory in 2014 and was recently appointed Deputy Head of the Centre for Cancer Research at Hudson Institute. He also recently became a Director on the Board of the Australia and New Zealand Sarcoma Association (ANZSA).

BRAIN TURBO SA ADVANCING PAEDIATRIC BRAIN TUMOUR RESEARCH THROUGH BIOBANKING

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Paediatric brain tumours are a devastating reality, and the leading cause of cancer-related deaths in children. That's why we're proud to have donated \$350,000 to the South Australian Health and Medical Research Institute (SAHMRI) to establish Brain Turbo SA, the first-ever Paediatric Central Nervous System Biobank in South Australia.

Brain Turbo SA has already collected over 1000 tissue samples, providing a crucial resource for researchers, clinicians and patients. This biobank is truly game-changing, as it enables clinical research and collaborations, giving researchers access to essential tissue samples. Researchers are now able to store, process and use leftover tissue samples to make progress towards finding a cure for childhood cancer.

"If we don't biobank tissue, the tumour stops with that patient. This means we can't learn more about why this happens, where this happens, the age group that happens to tissue is crucial for medical research. My Room's support has been critical. We couldn't have set up the biobank without it."

MYECHILD 01 CLINICAL TRIAL REVOLUTIONISING CHILDHOOD LEUKAEMIA TREATMENT

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We're also thrilled to partner with the Australian & New Zealand Children's Haematology/Oncology Group (ANZCHOG) on the innovative national MyeChild 01 clinical trial advancing childhood leukemia treatment. This collaborative trial involves ten hospitals across Australia and New Zealand, providing access to a new drug combination previously unavailable to Australian children.

Thanks to our funding of \$1,055,245 from 2018 to 2028, we're making a tangible difference in the lives of young cancer patients and their families. This promising international trial combines new drug therapies with existing treatments, instilling hope for improved survival rates.

PROFESSOR DAVID ASHLEY

Professor David Ashley's career in cancer research dates more than two decades. He is credentialed in both paediatric and adult neuro-oncology practice and this has been the focus of his efforts in translational research and leadership. His primary academic focus has been on neurologic tumours, the development of innovative therapies and approaches to care. These efforts have included basic and translational laboratory research.

David has expertise in immuno-oncology, having developed and clinically tested dendritic cell vaccines and other immuno-therapeutics. These achievements in research have led to change in practice in the care of children and adults with brain tumours, including the introduction of new standards of practice for the delivery of systemic therapy. He is highly regarded for this work. He has been the principal investigator of a number of important national and international studies, and is recognized as a senior figure in neuro-oncology internationally.



ASSOCIATE PROFESSOR JASON CAIN

A/Prof Jason Cain is head of the Developmental and Cancer Biology research group in the Centre of Cancer Research at the Hudson Institute of Medical Research. A/Prof Cain's research focus is to understand the roles of critical embryonic signalling pathways and epigenetic mechanisms in normal development and how dysregulation of these processes can lead to the initiation and progression of childhood cancers that can be therapeutically exploited.

In 2023, A/Prof Cain was appointed Deputy Director of the Centre for Cancer research at the Hudson Institute, and as a Director of the Australia and New Zealand Sarcoma Association. A/Prof Cain is a recipient of a Victorian Cancer Agency Mid-Career Fellowship and is currently the inaugural My Room Children's Cancer Charity Fellow and lead of the My Room Children's Cancer Charity Research Laboratory at the Hudson Institute of Medical Research.




