### 4 key principles and core standards of Humanitarian action



**Neutrality** 

Scouting is open and accessible to all, recognising, understanding and valuing the individual differences of members, local communities and all

societies



**Impartiality** 

Scouting gives equal access and opportunities, strongly opposing all forms of prejudice and discrimination we have regard for everyone.



Independence

NSO's are constituted as independent, non-political , voluntary movements of probity and effectiveness. Therefore NSO's have the autonomy of humanitarian objectives.



**Humanity** 

Scouting mission is to contribute to the education of children and young people on fundamental values of dignity, solidarity, tolerance, respect and equality. Duty to others is a fundamental principle of Scouting.

Scouting's values and method go hand in hand with humanitarian principles, even in the COVID-19 pandemic. Our response through: Awareness, skills for life, and improving opportunities for non-formal education, is essential.
