On the morning of February 19th Rowan Baxter killed his wife Hannah Clarke and their three children - Aaliyah, Laianah and Trey- by setting them alight in their car.

Many of you would be familiar with this story, but the power of understanding the patterns and behaviours that led to this tragedy may one day reduce the prevalence of domestic violence in Australia.

Since that fateful day, many have asked "Why?". Hannah's parents, Sue & Lloyd Clarke, have fought tirelessly to support DV victims and expose patterns of controlling behaviour - frequently referred to as coercive control. Hannah's family, friends and colleagues often comment that looking back with a broader understanding that abuse isn't always physical, warning signs were misunderstood or dismissed.

In honour of Hannah and her children, the SS4H foundation has created a unique Corporate Program, 'Hannah's Story', to educate and empower members of the community. This interactive workshop aims to ultimately create a world without domestic and family violence, one step at a time.
